

2. Pride \rightarrow Providence • Don't: Presume Superiority (v9b) • Do: Provide for the Needy (v10a) Promise: Satisfy Needs + Restore (v10b-12)

if you **spend yourselves** in behalf of the hungry and **satisfy the needs** of the oppressed,

3. Pleasure \rightarrow Praise

Don't: Do as We Please on Sabbath (v13)
Do: Consider Its Joy and Gravity (v13b)
Promise: Be Our Joy and Triumph (v14)

If you keep your **feet** from breaking the **Sabbath** and from doing as you please on my holy day,

> and if you honor it by not going your own way and not doing as you please or speaking idle words,

> > Isaiah 58:13b (NIV)

if you call the Sabbath a delight and the Lord's holy day honorable,
